Physical school is important because children need in-person learning and social interactions for their overall development and social and emotional well-being.



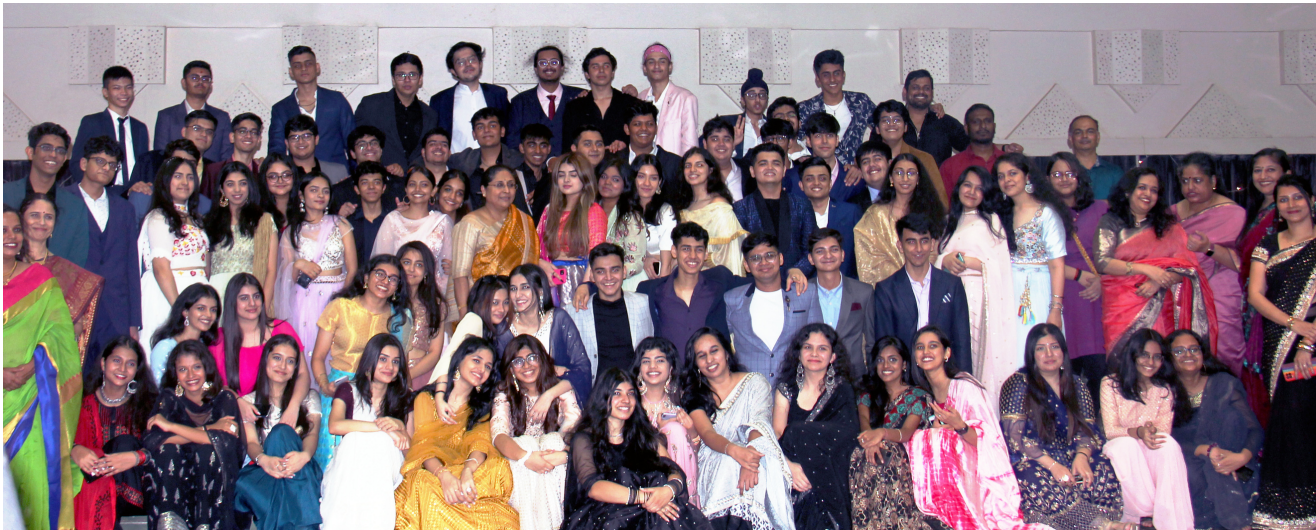

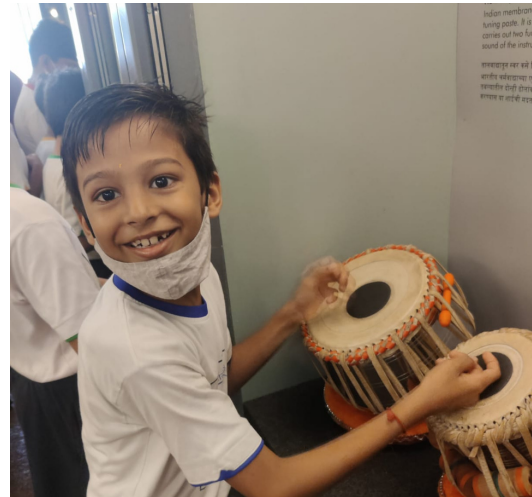




MUSEUM ON WHEELS

PRIDE TALK - Ayesha Ismail



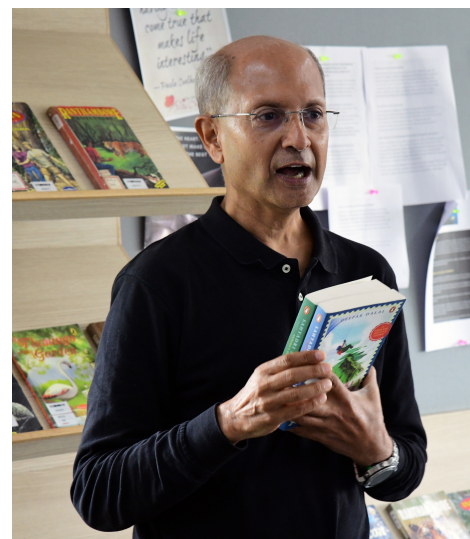
